



complete, one lacking the hasp), Provenance: small coronated bookplate inside front board and illegible names on endpapers, no place of publication although Berlin is mentioned on the verso of leaf 2, 1556. * This edition of Carion's Chronicle (first published in 1532) was extended after his death in 1537, taking the history up to the year 1554, with a considerable proportion of the text dealing with the events of the Reformation in Germany. Carion's Chronicles became an important work in Lutheran and more generally Protestant millenarian thought. This edition is not found in Adams, NUC, or the British Library Catalogue. (ALD/205) £950
